#### Points to Remember

- You have to type your report using single-spacing (1行).
- Refer to the "Sample Book Report" in the *Book Report* section on the teaching blog.
- If you have trouble typing your book report, you can use the "Book Report Template" in the *Book Report* section on the teaching blog.
- Remember to directly answer your questions and support your answer with reasons and specific examples from your book.

### I. MLA CITATION

- Use MLA citation to record your book's information.
- Note down the number of pages in the book and its level.

Author's name (family name, given name). *Book Title*. City of Publication: Publisher, year of publication.

### **II.** Responding to the Plot

- Answer *one* of following questions.
- Write *two paragraphs* for your answer.
- 1. If you were a character in the story, what would you have done differently?
- 2. If you were the author, what would you change in the book?
- 3. Was there a character especially inspiring, depressing or frightening. Explain why?
- 4. Choose a quotation from a character in the book, include the page number, and describe the situation in which the character makes the remark. Explain why you chose it.
- 5. Which incidents in the novel did you find wonderful, surprising, comical or shocking? Describe the incident and explain why it was wonderful, surprising, comical or shocking.
- 6. Were there any parts of the plot that you found too predictable or unbelievable? Give examples and explain why.
- 7. How did what you expect to happen in the book compare with what actually happened?

- 5. How does this book compare to books with a similar theme?
- 6. Try to find something about the author's life. What do you think might have inspired him/her to write the book?
- 7. Do you agree or disagree with the author's view of people and life? Support your opinion with reasons and examples.
- 8. What is something you learned from the story?
- 9. Have you changed your ideas about anything after reading this book?
