## **Details of Keynote Talk by Colin Thompson**

*Title:* Task-based learning, Project-based learning, CLIL, and their connections to CEFR

#### Abstract

In this keynote interactive presentation, Colin Thompson will explain task-based learning, project-based learning, Content and Language Integrated Learning (CLIL), and their relationship to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR).

#### Bio

Colin Thompson is an Associate Professor of Linguistics at Aoyama Gakuin University. He instructs courses on Second Language Acquisition and his research interests include psycholinguistics and pedagogy.

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### **Details of Featured Talk by Forrest Nelson**

*Title:* Incorporating CEFR Descriptors and Portfolio into the IE 2 Course

#### Abstract

Driven by the need to enhance its programs, the World Language Center (WLC) at Soka University initiated a project in 2019 to align its curriculum with the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR). This curriculum reform aimed to clarify course objectives and promote better understanding among students and instructors. A significant part of this effort involved introducing and developing the World Language Portfolio (WLP) as a tool to encourage student self-reflection, track progress, and foster greater independence in their language learning journey. In this talk, Forrest will introduce which aspects of the WLP and CEFR Descriptors he has incorporated into his IE 2 Core class. All materials will be shared with fellow IE instructors.

#### Bio

Forrest Mitchell Nelson is an assistant lecturer and upper-level class coordinator at Soka University's World Language Center. Teaching at AGU since 2003, he explores educational technology to support teachers. His research focuses on integrating the CEFR World Language Portfolio into his classes at Soka. In his free time, he performs with bands in the Kanto area.
